1. Mode of Transportation

a) Bicycles:

As the college is situated at the centre of the city about 5% of the students use bicycles and 40% of the students come by walk from the bus stand and around the college.

b) Public Transport:

Transport facility is provided by the institution with 04 buses for the students and staff from Kolar, Mulbagal, Vkota and Bangalore. Most of the students opt for public transport and utilize the RTC Bus Pass/Private Bus. In all 40% of student and staff use Public Transportation.


c) Pedestrian:

40% of the students come by walk from the bus stand and around the college.


d) Other: 15% of students and staff use bike.
